### Notice of Funding Availability

### FY2019 CoC New Permanent Housing Bonus

### *Rural Oregon Continuum of Care (ROCC) / OR-505 (Oregon Balance of State CoC)*

July 17, 2019

On July 3, 2019, HUD published the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Competition:

ROCC has opportunity to submit one or more applications totaling no more than \$177,353 in new/bonus project funding in this competition<sup>1</sup> and an additional opportunity to submit one but not more than three (3) applications totaling no more than \$354,706 specific to projects serving DV population.

All potential renewal and new project applicants must follow process and procedure outlined in the document titled '2019 OR-505 BOS CoC HOW TO APPLY' including submission of all documents outlined in Section 3/Page 1 of 7. Deadline to submit application packets is close of business Friday, August 9, 2019.

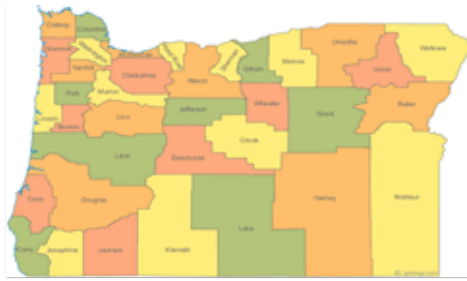
Note that the DRAFT application will be created in HUD's electronic application submission tool, *e-snaps*; potential applicants not already registered in e-snaps should do so straightaway. Selection through the local pre-application process does not guarantee the project will be awarded funding, only that it will be forwarded to HUD in a national competitive application for funding.

Eligible project applicants for this funding include non-profit organizations, states, local governments, instrumentalities of state and local governments, and public housing agencies; for-profit entities are not eligible to apply for grants or to be sub-recipients of grant funds. LOI may be submitted from any of ROCC's 28 counties: Baker, Benton, Clatsop, Columbia, Coos, Curry, Douglas, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Hood River, Josephine, Klamath, Lake, Lincoln, Linn, Malheur, Marion, Morrow, Polk, Sherman, Tillamook, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Wasco, Wheeler, and Yamhill.

- Types of new project applications permitted through the permanent housing bonus, which is 5 percent of a CoC's Final Pro Rata Need (PPRN) are:
  - Permanent supportive housing projects that meet requirements of DedicatedPLUS or the standard 100 percent dedicated for chronically homeless individuals and families;

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- Rapid rehousing projects that served individuals and families, including unaccompanied youth who meet the criteria outlined in the NOFA; and
- Joint TH and PH-RRH component projects.

New projects created through the permanent housing bonus must meet the project eligibility and threshold requirements established by HUD and outlined in Sections V.B.d. and V.G.e. of the NOFA.

Types of new projects applications permitted through the DV bonus are limited to a 1-year funding request and must follow the Housing First approach:

- Rapid Re-housing (PH-RRH) projects.
- Joint TH and PH-RRH component projects as defined in Section II.C.3.m of this NOFA.
- SSO Projects for Coordinated Entry (SSO-CE)
- Expansion of an existing renewal project to dedicate additional beds and services to the DV population.

New projects created through the DV bonus must meet the project eligibility and threshold requirements established by HUD and outlined in Sections II.B.4 of the NOFA.

New DV project applications must include partnership with local/regional DV provider or indicate clear expertise with providing services to DV victims and survivors. New DV project applicant must confirm ability to sub-contract, potentially across multiple jurisdictions.

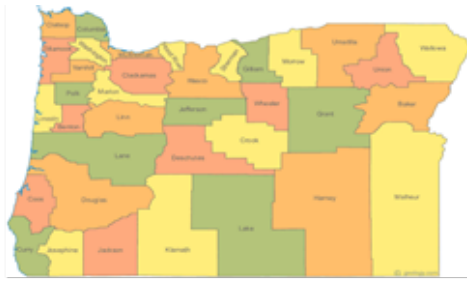
